Cholecystitis occurs when your gallbladder becomes inflamed. Gallbladder inflammation can be caused by: 1. Gallstones. Gallstones can block the tube (cystic duct) through which bile flows when it leaves the gallbladder. Bile builds up, causing inflammation. 2. Tumor. A tumor may prevent bile from draining out of your gallbladder properly, causing bile buildup that can lead to cholecystitis...

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The causes of cholecystitis include: 1. Gallbladder stone. Cholecystitis is usually associated with gallstone impacted in the cystic duct. 2. Bacteria. Bacteria plays a minor role in cholecystitis; however, secondary infection of bile occurs in approximately 50% of cases. 3. Alterations in fluids and electrolytes. Acalculous cholecystitis is speculated to be caused by alterations in fluids and electrolytes. 4. Bile stasis. Bile stasis or the lack of gallbladder contraction also play a role in...

However, in children **acalculous cholecystitis** is more common and is often the result of an **infectious** process. Case report: Here we present a case of **acute acalculous cholecystitis** caused by **infection** with Epstein-Barr virus in an otherwise healthy three-year-old male.

Acute acalculous cholecystitis due to hepatitis A ...

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The exact cause of AAC is unknown but thought to be induced by reduced blood flow to the gallbladder (ischemia), infectious disease or **lack of gallbladder stimulation** (not eating) causing biliary stasis (bile immobility) Although gallstones do not obstruct the bile duct in this form of cholecystitis, there may be other physical barriers present.
