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SPECIFIC COMMENTS TO AUTHORS

The authors reported an interesting case of concomitant gastric and pancreatic cancer with a rare histology. The case report should be improved for clarity and conciseness.

-Introduction: please remove the term "double" as it is confounding; use "concomitant" instead. -Case presentation: the first four sub-chapters can be merged (from "chief complaints" to "personal...") in one section called "clinical presentation" -The subchapters "final diagnosis" and "treatment" can be deleted. Chemotherapy can be reported at the end of the previous subchapter. -Discussion: it should be significantly shortened as there are repetitions. Moreover, keep the focus on the current presentation of the two diseases; there is no necessity to talk about other histological tumor types.
