**Answer:**

They were both 3-year-old boys from Shenyang and had no contact history. Neither of the two cases were vaccinated against pneumococcal .

**2. Reviewer:**

About the EBV and influenza B virus infection

**Answer:**

Relevant antibodies are detected in the serum, and the diagnosis is indeed not clear so related content has been deleted.

**3. Reviewer:**

Prolonged PTT is not typical of HUS. Do you have an explanation for that finding?

What is your explanation for this very high D-dimer?

**Answer:**

I think that microthrombosis activates the fibrinolytic system is a reasonable explanation. Related content has been deleted.
