Clarify standard usage of medical terms. List normal lab reference values. Clarify why CK7, CK20 and CDX2/SATB2 were not used to confirm this colonic primary. Discussion should be expanded referencing published cases and rapid tumor progression after immunosuppressant therapy. This paper requires further language polishing. (3) Format: There are 3 Tables and 4 Figures; (4) References: A total of 28 references are cited, including 3 reference published in the last 3 years; (5) Self-cited references: There is no self-cited references. The self-referencing rates should be less than 10%. Please keep the reasonable self-citations (i.e. those that are most closely related to the topic of the manuscript) and remove all other improper self-citations.
