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## SPECIFIC COMMENTS TO AUTHORS

It is an interesting case and has clinical guiding significance. It would be better if you could make some modifications 1. In the section of History of past illness, the time of history of hypertension should be clear in the sentence of "She also had hypertension." The correlation between hypertension and forearm compartment syndrome could also be discussed. 2. In the section Physical examination, it will be more consistent if "The volar compartment pressure" could be changed to "The pressure of volar compartment".

3. Activated partial thromboplastin time (aPTT) and APTT should be consistent in the context. 4. If available, it will be better to show the pictures of bilateral forearms, and lower abdomen, and right proximal thigh at the end of treatment.
