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SPECIFIC COMMENTS TO AUTHORS

Excellent report with a perfect balance of details and conclusions. I only had two questions regarding the terminology of semi-spontaneous nystagmus. I was unclear if it was referring to positional or movement induced nystagmus (i.e. BPPV type testing). Also, it was just a little unclear regarding the reporting of palpitations. He reported prodromal or then it also states he denied chest pain or palpitations. Clarification of prodromal vs other palpitations would be helpful.
