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## SPECIFIC COMMENTS TO AUTHORS

it is a well-written manuscript which studies a frequent consequence of adjuvant or palliative chemotherapy in colonic cancer. however some remarks seem necessary

1.The relatively small size of the study population contrasts with the frequency of the pathology,a muticentric study would be more relevant 2. the pulse studied certainly does not meet the second objective stated at the end of the introduction. in fact, a single-center study on 111 patients does not allow us to assess the global incidence of neuropathy. this objective must be corrected 3. form remarks: -the introduction is too long - the results of the questionnaires would have been expressed in 2 figures rather than successively relating all the questions of the questionnaires
