We would like to thank the three reviewers for their valuable suggestions. The manuscript has been improved according to the suggestions of reviewers:

1 Format has been updated

2 Revision has been made according to the suggestions of the reviewers:

(1) We have done our best to shorten the manuscript without impoverishing its content; it is now about 30% shorter than it was.

(2) We have added brief reference to the subgenotypes in the Abstract.

(3) The Core Tip has been changed as suggested by Reviewer #1 observation.

(4) As requested by Reviewers #1 and #2, the Introduction has been shortened by deleting the unnecessary information concerning the HBV replication cycle.

(5) The repetitions concerning the phylogenetic methods have been deleted throughout the manuscript and, as requested by Reviewers #1 and #2, the descriptions of previous published papers have been reduced to the essential.

(6) The Conclusion section has been changed, and we hope the final message is now more intelligible.

(7) The number of references has been reduced by about 20%, and they have been revised.

(8) The presentation of the figures and tables is now more homogeneous.

(9) Reference numbers have been added to Table 2 as requested by Reviewers #1 and #2.

(10) The manuscript has been revised by a mother-tongue English teacher.

(11) There were no overlapping legends in the original Figure 2; they were probably due to the conversion of the .pdf file.
