In this report, the authors compared standard endoscopy and magnified narrow-band imaging (NBI-M) in the diagnosis of Helicobacter pylori (H. pylori) infections, atrophic gastritis (AG) and intestinal metaplasia (IM), but letter to the editor for the manuscript is usually rebuttal or approval for the results. (3) Format: There are no tables and figures. (4) References: A total of 4 references are cited, including 2 references published in the last 3 years; (5) Self-cited references: There is one self-cited reference. (6) References recommendations: There is no recommended reference. The authors have the right to refuse to cite improper references recommended by the peer reviewer(s), especially those published by the peer reviewer(s) him/herself (themselves).
