The 'ARTICLE HIGHLIGHTS' section provides comments for original articles in accordance with the specified format. The 'REFERENCFS' section lists the references in the Vancouver style. This style uses Arabic numeral in-text citations based on the order of the first appearance of a source in the text. For citations where the author's name is indicated in the text, a superscript number should be placed following the name (i.e.,, "Pang et al"). For citations where no author is indicated, a superscript number should be placed at the end of the sentence.
