	authors should be commended for the scope of the paper and the	
	balanced style used, which could be an essential addition to the	
	present literature on the topic. The questions raised by the	
	reviewers should be answered; (3) Format: There are no tables and	
2	no figures; (4) References: A total of 107 refences are cited, including	
2	72 references published in the last 3 years; (5) Self-cited references:	
	There are 6 self-cited references. The self-referencing rates should be	
	less than 10%. Please keep the reasonable self-citations (i.e. those	
	that are most closely related to the topic of the manuscript) and	
	remove all other improper self-citations. If the authors fail to	
	address the critical issue of self-citation, the editing process of this	
	manuscript will be terminated; and (6) References	
	recommendations: The authors have the right to refuse to cite
