My only real comment is it is unclear why the study subjects, many in their 40s underwent a colonoscopy. screening is not usually performed in this age, This point needs to be clarified both in terms of the reason for the colonoscopy and any possible underlying illnesses and the ethical issue of performing an invasive endoscopic procedure.
