They presented the case of a 4-year-old boy with multidrug-resistant epilepsy and poor response to vagus nerve stimulation, showing better therapeutic responding to perampanel. The authors reported his detailed clinical course and emphasized the therapeutic potential of perampanel for young children with multidrug-resistant epilepsy. Although the main findings in this research is interesting, there are several major and minor points which should be addressed for the acceptance. Major 1. The authors showed the literature review about the therapeutic efficacy of perampanel in young children. Although this review is very valuable, the authors should refer to the result of this review in Discussion section in a more detailed way, particular in therapeutic efficacy and adverse events in young children. Minor 1. Since this report is a case presentation, the title should be modified, "A young child with multidrug~". 2. In background of Abstract section, the authors should provide the clinical problems or limitations to emphasize the importance of this case report in a more detailed way. 3. In the outcome and follow-up section, the authors should provide the precise follow-up duration after the introduction of perampanel. 4. If available, please provide the result of brain MRI examination after the introduction of perampanel. 5. In Discussion section, the reference is not enough. The authors should provide appropriate reference numbers in each sentence in necessary. 6. In the final paragraph of Discussion section, the authors should provide the keywords and the duration for searching reports for the literature review.
