Of note is that the section “Differentiating Brugada Phenocopy from Brugada Syndrome” along with Table 2, in our opinion, provides sufficient detail in clarifying the distinction between these two phenomena with the knowledge that our scientific community has acquired to date. Additionally, the purpose of this invited editorial was to summarize the current knowledge of Brugada Phenocopy and not specifically to provide advancements.
 - 3.3. Comment 2: Thank you for your interest in our paper. The take-home message of this invited editorial was to discuss the conceptual emergence of BrP as a new ECG phenomenon, review the progress made to date, and identify opportunities for further investigation.
