The second and third paragraphs, after a suitable shortening of their length, can be joined into one and would need a reference. I strongly suggest using this one: Mejía-Zambrano H. Radiological and functional pulmonary complications in patients recovered from COVID-19. *Microb Infect Chemother.* 2021; 1: e1217. <https://doi.org/10.54034/mic.e1217> The fourth paragraph where they make the most important contribution, is very long, I suggest dividing it, according to topics, into 2 or 3 small paragraphs to facilitate reading. The irradiation of this procedure and its consequences on the health of patients should also be mentioned, since usually patients with COVID-19 have already undergone one or two procedures of this type in the acute stage of the disease.
