Dear Dr yong thank you for consulting us as reviewer , our goal is to help you do your best work and to save your precious time .At the same time we think following consideration should be made in your studies , some of important points given below need to be explained and make it correct 1 This study had a few limitations. First, this was a retrospective study conducted at a single institution and all diagnoses were based on the results of radiologic findings 2 Results are limited by the lack of comparative study for this clinical situation with inclusion of a control group without pneumoperitoneum. 3 As they mentioned it was on radiographic bases so it would be better to add more radiological pictures 4 Citations are too old, need to add latest literature we would love to highlight latest studies 5 English proficiency need to be correct especially in discussion part, many lines written in discussion part need to be explain in professional English 6 Discussion part still needs to explain more about distinct clinical features of SP to guide appropriate management by comparing characteristics between SP and typical pneumoperitoneum secondary to gastrointestinal perforation. 7 This study did not find a significant correlation between these variables with high mortality. Instead, only preterm infants were significantly associated with high mortality. looking forward for your manuscript again best regards

It is not clear for me, that the mortality of operative intervention (which is nontherapeutic) having less mortality rate compared with the conservative management which is the ideal management for such cases. I think that there are other factors related to the higher mortality rate in the conservative group that need to be discussed.
