SPECIFIC COMMENTS TO AUTHORS

The paper deals with an important and still enigmatic field in human virology, the occult hepatitis B infection (OBI). An exhaustive description of OBI would exceed the frame of a normal review and would need an entire book. The author has very well illuminated the main features of OBI and discusses many of the current theories on its evolution after and during transmission of HBV. I have entered some minor corrections directly in the text (attached). Specific points Among the not sufficiently considered aspects is 1. The question of infectivity originating from OBI carriers by organ transplantation and elsewhere 2. The role of vaccination for induction of OBI after exposure and the potential protection of OBI carriers against additional infection by HBV. 3. The role of HBsAg assays which are "supersenstive" and/or dissociate HBs immune complexes is not mentioned.

SPECIFIC COMMENTS TO AUTHORS

This review article analysed the literature for viral and host factors that interact and lead to an occult form of the HBV infection, including the recent discoveries in miRNA involvement, epigenetic mechanisms, immune system factors and viral variants. A lot of effort was put into this minireview. However, there are two major concerns: 1. The review will be much clearer if the author summarizes the key points in one or two tables or highlight with figures on the host immune response and mechanisms lead to OBI. In its current form, it is quite hard for non-HBV expert to understand and retain the key points in the manuscript. 2. I understand this to be a review article, but there are too many lines that will not pass the authentication standards necessary to avoid future challenges if published in its present form. I pasted a few examples in the uploaded file. I would suggest the author to do a careful check and re-write the lines in his own words in the next revision.
