Strangely the figure 1b (radiograph of right tibia) that authors pretend to be normal / with no changes, must be mistakenly inserted. I see there several screws and a plate indicating clearly a surgically treated fracture of fibula etc. Do you think Figure 1b is inserted wrong; or will you change its description / even inside the main text? For a person that has been training so hard, is usual to see increased values of CPK. Please insert these values of CPK in the manuscript, even if those have remained within norm.
