The topic of this manuscript falls within the scope of World Journal of Clinical Cases. The Authors reported the case of a woman with non-classic Congenital lipid Adrenal Hyperplasia (lipoid CAH) combined with hyperthyroidism. Her chromosome karyotype was 46,XX and high-throughput sequencing revealed two missense variants in the StAR gene: c.229c>t (p.Q77X) and c.814C>T (p.R272C). The patient was treated for hyperthyroidism in a timely manner and the dosage of glucocorticoid was adjusted during the treatment of hyperthyroidism. The Authors described the first case of non-classic lipoid CAH combined with hyperthyroidism reported in the Chinese population. Abstract, Introduction and Case Report are good. Discussion sound well. Complete the References.

Correction 2: The case report section is presented in a very messy manner. Medical and family history should go to the beginning. In the last paragraphs of this section, I recommend that the authors not go back in time, because the thread is lost. I agree that the case report section describes the natural history of the disease, from birth to the present, however, check this part. Correction 3: Please specify what was the cause of hyperthyroidism in the patient. Graves' disease?
