Is the sentence accurate? The patient has developed blood pressure and heart rate problems. 3. how long after that did the patient's hemodynamics become stable? The treatment method should be further described in detail, such as what hemostatic drugs are used? How to carry out anti shock treatment? 4. please provide pictures of scars at the esophageal ulcer on the 60th day after operation. 5. why only use PubMed search? Do you need to use other databases? 6. as a literature review, table 2 should also list the basic information and treatment of patients, such as age, sex, complications, imaging findings, prognosis time, etc. 7."where we found 17 cases from January 1, 2014, through March 31, 2022 (Table 2)[2,5,7,9-17]". Whether the references cited here are correct, for example, 12. The object described here is diabetic rat. Please verify other references cited.
