The work is interesting, the paper is very well-written, and there are not many similar cases described in the literature about this topic. Abstract: inadequate. In the abstract, you must briefly summarize the case report. Keywords: inadequate. Please, reach at least 5. Reference: please, add the suggested ones. Paper On some aspects, the authors should address: 1)In addition to dermoscopy, have you considered using high-resolution ultrasound? In this order, I suggest you to read this interesting US-hystopathology correlation article: -Ultrasound Image of a Stair-Like Border in Circumscribed Palmar Hypokeratosis. doi: 10.1016/j.ad.2020.11.023. 2)Regarding the clinical application of ultrasound, it is our intention to promote the use of high-resolution ultrasound and the microvascularization softwares (for example, SMI) for the morphological and functional correlation of skin lesions. In my opinion, it would be interesting to introduce briefly these concepts into the discussion.
