In the manuscript entitled "Clinical features of elderly patients with COVID-19 in Wuhan, China", the authors investigated the effect impact of COVID-19 on elder patients from Wuhan. The authors assumed that the mortality due to SARS-Cov infection could not be affected by age and chronic disease comorbid. Indeed, the novelty of the study is too weak. Similar findings have been published previously in several studies like 10.1016/j.jinf.2020.03.005, doi.org/10.1186/s12877-020-01811-5, doi.org/10.1186/s12877-021-02261-3, doi.org/10.1590/1980-57642021dn15-010001, doi.org/10.1159/000508734. Due to COVID-19 features fast changes, I think the results of this study are too old to be published now

Although the study is interesting and well-conducted, the study sample is too small. How was this sample size calculated? Considering the number of cases of covid-19 in China, studying just the patients hospitalized in 1 month is not enough. Thus, you should analyze the cases of covid-19 for at least 6 months or 1 year. Add the year and date of the approval of the ethics committee. Bold the significant P-values in the tables.
