Dear Editors:

My colleagues and I are very pleased to resubmit the manuscript entitled "Baseline moderate-range albuminuria is associated with protection against severe coronavirus disease 19 pneumonia" for consideration by the World Journal of Diabetes. We are grateful for your helpful reviews and comments, which indeed led to clarifications and additions that have improved the manuscript. We are hereby presenting the revisions, hopefully making the article ready for acceptance.

We feel that this manuscript adds valuable information to the evolving literature of risk factors for severe COVID-19 pneumonia in diabetic patients, providing additional unique information about the protective association of moderate-range albuminuria in diabetic patients with CKD I-II. We hypothesize that this counterintuitive association can represent intact interferon signaling that on the one hand may lead to harmful proteinuria and on the other hand can serve as a protective cytokine that has the potential to mitigate COVID-19 infection and complications. We would be pleased if World Journal of Diabetes would favorably consider our manuscript for publication.

The following is a detailed inventory of the requirements and our responses (in **bold**):

- Why the authors stated heart failure as separated from CVD.
 - **We thank the reviewer for this comment, as CVD does indeed include heart failure; therefore, we deleted this duplication.**
- In the methodology section, the authors should mention the date and the number of the ethical approval certificate.
 - **We added this in the methods, as requested. The approval and informed consent documents have been provided.**
- In the subheading statistical analysis, the author should remove the statement "Statistical methods were approved by and analyses were performed and reviewed by a statistician at the Galilee Medical Center."
 - **It has been removed.**
- I could not find any information on race of cohort members.
 - **The race of the participants was added to Tables 1, 2, and 3.**
- The authors should include the small sample size use in this study as one of the limitations.
 - **We added this limitation to the discussion.**
- Maybe one of the serious concerns in this manuscript is the very small sample sized used I think it should be increased.
 - **We agree that a larger sample size is desirable. Since we recruited all patients who met the inclusion criteria within the relevant time periods,**

we could not increase the sample size. Of note, the significance of albuminuria is even more impressive given the small sample.




