The authors reported a case of multiple small intestinal angiosarcomas that resulted in intestinal obstruction with lumbar and bilateral adrenal metastases. They found that small intestinal angiosarcoma occurred mainly in older men, and the most common symptom was gastrointestinal bleeding, which mainly manifested as melena. The main treatment methods were surgical resection and chemotherapy, which effectively improved patients' survival. This will help clinicians to understand small intestinal angiosarcomas and guide their clinical diagnosis and treatment.
