Extensive language editing is must. Microangiopathy has not been proved. The number of relevant references can be reduced to less than 15. Incidental suppression of thrombopoiesis in response to very high dose of steroid can't be a causal but needs proper literature review and large observation. The text burden is high in the abstract, introduction and discussion.
