Question 1:

-In the Discussion section, the relationship (or not) between having many abortions and the appearance of ovarian choriocarcinoma should be mentioned.

<u>Answer:</u> We reviewed the related literature again and revised in the discussion section of our manuscript and the altered section was highlighted red in the revised manuscript.

Question 2:

-The authors describe that the patient was on her 50's, with a menopause that occurred 8 years ago. My question is, was it an early menopause?

<u>Answer:</u> Due to the rarity of ovarian choriocarcinoma, we cannot reach this conclusion yet. Several studies have suggested the origin of germ cell tumor. In addition, the early menopause of this patient may correlate with her left oophorocystectomy.

Minor changes:

-In the Introduction section, when saying Ovarian choriocarcinomas, "(OC)" should be added, because at the end of page 8, OC appears as it is.
