For the definition of long - COVID, it is recommended to refer to CDC's guidelines for a clearer description. I do not recommend to quote the relevant statements above on geios, because the unofficial definition is not enough to guide clinical research. 2. The theoretical explanation is too simple. It is suggested to add mechanism, legend and other information to supplement the theoretical content 3. Specific clarification is needed in terms of treatment methods
