Sustained remission was carried out up to 17 months of observation of the patient after the second radical stage of the surgical operation (gastrectomy). The role of adjuvant therapy 17 years ago associated with breast cancer is discussed. The article is fully consistent with the theme of the journal WJGS. In this, the authors reported a case of successful radical resection with completely after modified laparoscopic subtotal gastrectomy a stomach-partitioning gastrojejunostomy for obstruction relief, in a patient with gastric outlet obstruction. The authors performed a modified stomach-partitioning gastrojejunostomy, complete laparoscopic stomach-partitioning gastrojejunostomy combined with No. 4sb lymph node dissection, for obstruction relief. No recurrences were observed 17 months post-operatively. This case is rare and very interesting. The manuscript is very well written. Minor revision: 1. The words in the figures are too small, please change this. 2. The references list should be edited and updated. 3. Some minor language polishing should be revised.
