#### SPECIFIC COMMENTS TO AUTHORS

The authors reported a patient with laryngeal herpes zoster that caused persistent throat pain and cough. The persistent pain and cough disappeared after superior laryngeal nerve block, under ultrasonographic guidance. The report is valuable for physicians who are devoted to pain treatment; however, I have several comments to improve the report. Figure 1 needs which side is left of the larynx. When was the photo taken after the onset of herpes zoster? Did you measure antibody titers to varicella-zoster virus after the onset of pain and cough? How severe was the cough? Was it continual or sporadic? The patient received pregabalin 150 mg, tramadol 100 mg, and nortriptyline 10 mg a day for two months, without changing the doses of medications. Why were the doses of medications not increased for two months even the patient had moderate pain? Since nerve block is invasive treatment, recommended first line of treatment for the patient is to increase the doses of medications, even the duration of postherpetic neuralgia was around two months. Why did you choose nerve block for the treatment of the patient? I would like to recommend that the sentence "Consent for publication of this case report was obtained from the patient." be stated immediately after "CASE PRESENTATION."



Discussion Page 8, lines 4-3 from the bottom of the discussion: You cited references 1, 10, and 11; however, these reports were clinical ones. They did not study mechanisms of post-herpetic neuralgia. I do not think citation of these reports is correct. END

The title reflects the main subject of the manuscript. The abstract summarizes adequately the work described in the manuscript. The key words reflect the focus of The manuscript needs more elaboration to adequately describe the the manuscript. background and significance of the study. The methods section describes the procedure done in the study. "Chest radiograph" needs to be removed from under the laboratory investigations section. Some more details of the drugs and US device used should be provided. Adding a figure for the injection technique and point of insertion is recommended, it would add a value to clinicians reading the manuscript. The results of the study seem to add a simple solution to a severe and rare problem away from routine medications. The discussion is well written. The CARE checklist has been followed.
