**Specific Comments to Authors:** The present manuscript describes the case of a patient with alveolar echinococcosis and ex vivo liver resection and autotransplantation as an adequate therapy. The article is well structured and clear. The comparison with the current literature shows the special character of this therapy. Perhaps the possibility of liver transplantation should be discussed more intensively despite the current shortage of organs. If only the prognosis for this young patient with a liver transplant had been excellent.
