Dilations in EoE patients with dysphagia were reported in 27-30% of all EoE cases based on two large series. See discussion page 10

(5) How to have an index of suspicion about this possibility while evaluating a case?

Added in discussion a list of EoE symptoms that should raise a concern about the possibility of EoE. Page 10-11

(6) Comparative literature from Europe, China, Japan, South East Asia needs to be addressed.

Available literature suggests that EoE has been seen at lower rates in Middle East, China and Japan,

however only a few studies in English literature addressed this issue. See references 26-27

An incidence of EoE in Brazil and Turkey and Europe is similar to US and Canada. See discussion page 10

(7) References were updated and added as per request re: brief article

(8) A photo of EoE pathology was added page 7 (text)

(9) Phone and fax numbers were corrected.
