SPECIFIC COMMENTS TO AUTHORS

A quality assessment of surgery mainly includes CME, CVL and D3 for colorectal cancer was discussed here, on the whole, there is not much to be picky about. Two points or suggestions, 1)Please talk a little about intraoperative and postoperative outcomes of CME, e.g. one report shows higher overall complication rates with CME and increased intraoperative blood loss. 2)Besides these familiar surgical procedures, how about other emerging perspectives, e.g. applying artificial intelligence (AI) and computer vision (CV) for quality assurance.
