Reviewer # 1

Major points:

1. Please clarify how to choose stent type for each case?

Answer: stent type was individually selected in a case by case basis, and according to referring physician preference.

2. Follow-up intervals of two groups were different; therefore it could influence some outcomes.

Please describe this point as limitation of this study.

Answer: although some patients in the multiple plastic stent (MPS) group have a longer follow-up, mean and median (\pm SD) follow-up is similar: 690.8, 538 (\pm 632.6) for MPS *versus* 620.3, 479 (\pm 540.7) days for covered self-expandable metal stents (cSEMS).

3. I supposed that this paper was not review but original article, but their conclusion was based half on the result of literature review. I recommend to focus on their study results and shorten the review part.

Answer: manuscript was reviewed.

Reviewer #2

Minor points:

1. cSEMS, namely Covered self-expandable metal stents, should not be firstly appeared with abbreviation in the Abstract.

Answer: abbreviation was corrected.

2. Section of Results seems to be confused. Authors should express it with more clear and logics.

Answer: manuscript was reviewed.

Endoscopic treatment was performed with placement of a fully covered SEMS across the stricture as a primary therapy option (B). C: endoscopic view of the FCSEMS after 6 months in place.
