SPECIFIC COMMENTS TO AUTHORS

The manuscript is a systematic review about de novo non-alcoholic fatty liver disease (NAFLD) after pancreatectomy. The authors reviewed papers from 2001 to 2022 and summarized patterns and risk factors of post pancreatectomy de novo NAFLD. Although it is a broad and well-considered paper, there are a few areas that I would like to point out that could be improved. In METHODS, the authors stated that they reviewed 79 papers, but some of the references are duplicated. For example, 16 and 50, 13 and 34 are same paper. Table 1 shows the incidence of NAFLD by surgical procedure and etiology, but there are 1 or 2 references for each condition, and it is desirable to include more references. In addition to the references given in this manuscript, there are other publications that discuss de novo NAFLD and should be included as references. For example, Surgery. 2016 Aug; 160(2):318-30. Figures are poorly explained. In Figure 2, the pathogenesis, treatment, and results are arranged vertically in boxes of the same shape, and their relationship is unclear. Nor is it shown what the solid and dotted lines represent. Defect in Choline Synthesis and Hypocarnitenemia are arranged vertically, but reading the text, it seems that they are independent factors, so it seems inappropriate to arrange them vertically. The order in which the figures appear in the text and the figure numbers are different. Since Figure 1 appears last, it is better to change the order.
