This meaning should be added. 4. There are many spelling mistakes. For exp. "associated to the so-called", "in fatty infiltration, to non-alcoholic steatohepatitis (NASH) with fatty infiltration", "same patient simultaneously", "importing serum" "storing and", "pathophysiology has" "liver appears to be more vulnerable to the" ".....Should be reconsidered.
