Why do they state that the bladder cancer is a metastases of the kidney. 5. It is difficult to believe that a patient lived 6 years after being diagnosed with metastatic bladder cancer, without any treatment.

1. The grade of the urothelial tumors should be specified.

Author: Relevant content has been added to the article.

“The pathological findings revealed noninvasive low-grade papillary urothelial carcinoma of the renal pelvis.”

2. Why was intravesical chemotherapy given to T1 tumor?

Author: Although radical nephrectomy has been performed on renal pelvis cancer, there is still a possibility of bladder implantation of tumor cells and a significantly increased risk of bladder tumor recurrence. So, postoperative chemotherapy is used.

3. What was the follow-up after the kidney removal?

Author: Regular follow-up every 3-6 months after surgery for a total of two years.

4. Why do they state that the bladder cancer is a metastases of the kidney.

Author: The following diagnostic criteria have been adopted by most clinicians to differentiate synchronous primaries from malignant deposits: (1) lack of anatomical continuity between two tumors; (2) a growth pattern typical of a primary tumor; and (3) clear histological differences between two tumors.

According to the above criteria, there is anatomical continuity between two tumors; the growth patterns of the two tumors are similar; the histology of the two types of tumors is also similar. So, we believe that there is a metastatic relationship between these two tumors.

5. It is difficult to believe that a patient lived 6 years after being diagnosed with metastatic bladder cancer, without any treatment.
