COMMENTS TO AUTHORS

The case report requires work for completion. The questions remain to be answered: Chest and abdominal CT scans are missing; the exclusion of mediastinal and abdominal lymphoma /sarcoma is part of the diagnostic workup. Abdominal Doppler US: exclusion of portal hypertension or failed mesenteric venous circulation are also parts of the differential diagnostic work. The relatively short term octreotide treatment resulted remission .Are the gastrointestinal neuroendocrine diseases excluded? The are no data about.
