First please follow the instruction for authors and adjust the manuscript accordingly. Second, try to produce a clear definition of coeliac crisis (CC) and characterize the



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condition. What you have written in introduction is very little and nonspecific. Please set some criteria for coeliac crises. You can do that based on your literature review you have undertaken. 3rd, there is no need for such big table. Please summarize and break it down in 2 small tables; for instance one with clinical presentation of CC, and the other one with histology and other investigations 4th for describing the histology please refer to the last Bucharest consensus: Rostami K, Marsh MN, Johnson MW, et al. Gut 2017;66:2080–2086

This is a well written case-report meta-analysis paper concerning the elucidation of prevalence, clinical, laboratory and histological characteristics of Celiac crisis adult patients based on analysis of 42 cases presented in 29 articles published from January 1970 to 2018. The authors present detailed description of inclusion and exclusion



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criteria applied to select literature. The authors give the extensive description of clinical manifestations, laboratory data and diagnostic approach of reported patients with celiac crisis. The present meta-analysis showed that celiac crisis is rarely estimated form of celiac disease in clinical practice, with female predominance. The authors pointed attention to better differentiation diagnosis of these patients and their further treatment and monitoring especially under gluten free diet condition. The authors have reviewed and analyzed sufficient amount of literature. The review is supplied with 1 Tables. The following point need to be considered: 1. It is necessary to give explanation to some abbreviations in the text, like "INR" and "GFR".
