SPECIFIC COMMENTS TO AUTHORS

The article reported a case of polymorphic ventricular arrhythmia that caused by aconite ingestion, which was refractory to amiodarone treatment, but was successfully suppressed by landiolol. It is a meaningful finding since it is the first report that landiolol can be used as a treatment for amiodarone-refractory ventricular arrhythmias caused by aconite intoxication. There are some poits in the article that should be modified and improved: 1, In this case, the patient ingested aconite, not aconitine. So the title should be "Recurrent ventricular arrhythmia due to aconite intoxication successfully treated with landiolol: A case report" and the aconitum alkaloids including aconitine, mesaconitine, hypaconitine et al should be studied and discussed. 2, "Aconitum alkaloids" should be used ,but not "aconitine alkaloids". 3, Fig 2 has much information of time course and treatment, which is not clearly described in the article. And its figure legend is too simple. 4, At the admission, the patient had obvious symptoms of gastrointestinal and nevous intoxication. This report should mention what treatment (or no treatment) was carried out to treat such symptoms, and compare the gastrointestinal and nevous symptoms before and after landiolol treatment. Overall, it
