This is a timely and well written review of liver splitting for transplantation. It is important to separate the livers from cadaveric donors that undergo splitting and those from living donors as the process the liver goes through and the 'risks' to the donor are very different. The authors would do well to avoid the word 'harvest' in relation to



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organ procurement as this can become emotive in some countries. Otherwise I would commend the authors for their work and suggest the inclusion of some diagrammatic representation of a split liver, vascular structures, etc as this would aide the reader who is not a liver surgeon.
