This is an extremely important topic to discuss. The basic emphasis of the article is very well stated. This editorial/perspective could be strengthened by including graphics and tables. For example, showing the countries where abortion services available and where restricted could be portrayed with a world map, color identification of categories. It would be helpful to include tables showing existing estimates of unwanted pregnancies. The section 'THE WAY FORWARD' leads the reader to find something helpful but there is nothing identified that follows, so that the section seems to be a conclusion rather than opening the door to concrete steps that could be taken. Lots of promise here, if developed sufficiently. If it were to be developed, I can see that I could grade this in an "excellent" category.

- \* Strengthen the discussion in education. Due to the unwanted pregnancies are mostly because of unmet of effective contraception, no matter because of lacking of contraceptives itself or not using or ignored, furthermore due to this knowledge is educated through rather than clinical medicine, it is important to plant the concepts of preventive contraception into the unmarried women and families. The review mentioned about the educational and communicational program and family planner strengthen program. But not in depth.
