The authors reported a case of ectopic opening of the common bile duct in the antrum. However, ectopic opening of the common bile duct is a well-known biliary anomaly. It also may be limited in the current form. Comments: 1. The authors present a figure of endoscopic images of pyloric ring. However, the authors should provide the images of hooking common bile duct by cholangiography (MRCP or direct cholangiography) if they would like to argue this is the ectopic opening of the common bile duct. 2. What is the meaning of “cholecystitis after laparoscopic cholecystectomy” in the History of past illness?
