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SPECIFIC COMMENTS TO AUTHORS

This is an interesting case of a patient complained of enlarged right-sided cervical lymph nodes and progressive pain aggravation of the right shoulder. This case was diagnosed with classical Hodgkin's lymphoma by biopsy of the right cervical lymph node. Clinical data found that resistance to immune checkpoint inhibitors may be reversed by hypomethylating agents, such as decitabine, in heavily pretreated classical Hodgkin's lymphoma patients. This case is rare and the clinical data of the case is described in detail, include the complaints, history of the present illness and past illness. Also, the laboratory and imaging examinations are described in the main text. Finally, the diagnosis was made based the examinations, and the treatment was successful. Overall, the manuscript is very well written, and the case report is worthy to be published. Comments: 1. Please take attention to some abbreviations. Unusual abbreviation should not be used. 2. Please list the specific date instead of the word "now" at the "outcome and follow-up" section, line 4. 3. A minor editing is required. Some minor language polishing should be corrected.
