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SPECIFIC COMMENTS TO AUTHORS

This manuscript provided an interesting and rare case with fistula formation between the esophagus and a nonaneurysmal RBA, in the setting of palliative esophageal metallic stenting and previous left pneumonectomy. By a minimally-invasive step-up way with esophageal restenting followed by RBA embolization, the GI bleeding stopped and the patient was successfully discharged. I think follow-up work is very important. The authors need to closely follow the patient's prognosis for rebleeding or other complications. In addition, some references should be supplemented and updated.
