### COMMENTS TO AUTHORS

This is a straightforward clinical case study reporting on a liposarcoma patient that presents with a cutaneous sarcoid reaction. At the same time the authors review the literature listing all cases of soft tissues sarcoma that are linked to a sarcoid reaction. Comments: 1) Can the authors provide more information on the liposarcoma (subtype, location, recurrence/metastasis). How was the patient treated? This is useful information in this context. 2) Have the authors followed the guidelines and jurisdiction regarding studies involving cancer patients and sought approval to carry out and publish this study from a institutional medical ethical committee? Please specify in manuscript and provide proof of approval. I was surprised to see the name of the patient in full on the form included as supplemental data.
