The manuscript described the prevalence of erectile dysfunction is higher in patients with essential hypertension and even two times higher risk. What is the mechanism and pathophysiology? How about previous literature discussed? Please describe more detail. 2. The authors demonstrated initially dividing to two paragraphs: Untreated hypertensive patients and treated hypertensive patients. However, the content is mixed up. For example, the discussion in untreated hypertensive patients (means hypertensive patients without antihypertensive treatment) paragraph still illustrated about antihypertensive agents. It should be more precise. 3. In "Management beyond PDE-5 inhibitors" paragraph, the surgical implantation of a penile prosthesis is for general erectile dysfunction patients but did not discuss about erectile dysfunction in hypertension. Is there any previous literature discussed specifically? 4. What is the impact of PDE-5 inhibitors on cardiovascular effect? 5. Is the treatment of erectile dysfunction in hypertension is different from in normotensive patients? are there any important things the physicians must pay attention to during treatment? 6. The author should add a paragraph discussing about the alpha-blocker treatment for hypertension and LUTS as well as the potential benefit on erectile dysfunction. 7. The author should mention about the treatment options after PDE-5 inhibitor failed, like PGE1 penile injection, vacuum device... etc. then the penile prosthesis implantation.
