SPECIFIC COMMENTS TO AUTHORS

There are no rationale behind selection of fibrinogen-like protein 1 (FGL1). Authors have discussed how CD is related to with TNFalpha however no basic information about fibrinogen-like protein 1 (FGL1) is mentioned in the introduction. Fibrinogen-like protein 1 (FGL1) has suddenly appeared in the last paragraph of the introduction "Our data showed that fibrinogen-like protein 1 (FGL1) was significantly upregulated in the plasma of CD patients, which was further verified in intestinal tissues". I think author should give a bit description about FGL1 and its relation and rationale in context to the present study.
