The abstract summarizes and reflects the work described in the manuscript. Please check the word count. The keywords reflect the focus of the manuscript. A core tip has been given which justifies the need for this case report. Similar case report was published by N M Gupta et al in Indian Journal of Gastroenterology. The manuscript describes the background, present status, and significance of the case report. The manuscript describes methods in adequate detail. The manuscript interprets the findings adequately and appropriately, highlighting the key points concisely, clearly, and logically. It discusses the paper's scientific significance and/or relevance to clinical practice sufficiently. This work has been tailored with available literature. The figures, diagrams, and tables are sufficient, good quality, and appropriately illustrative of the paper contents. This is a case report and thus the manuscript meets the requirements of biostatistics without any testing of hypothesis.
