SPECIFIC COMMENTS TO AUTHORS

The authors report a case report of a 48-year-old man with successive ischemic malignant strokes in a patient with multiple fusiform aneurysms showing a devastating outcome despite conservative treatment. This case report is potentially interesting, but the manuscript can be improved according to the following minor suggestions: 1Please add in the title "ischemic" ("ischemic malignant strokes"). 2.It should be noted in the Introduction, that in a hospital clinical series, decreased level of consciousness, nausea or vomiting, and heavy smoking were the main clinical factors associated with malignant middle cerebral artery infarction (Rev Invest Clin 2015: 67: 64-70). We recommend including and commenting on this reference. helpful to mention that the differential diagnosis of the presented case also refers to hematological disorders. It would be interesting to mention that hematological disorders are another commonly unrecognized cause of both acute stroke of unusual etiology and malignant ischemic stroke (Expert Rev Hematol 2016; 9: 891-901). The inclusion and comment on this reference is recommended. Did the authors consider this in their study protocol? 4.t would be interesting if the authors included in the text some of



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the limitations of this case note. 5.A brief concluding comment on possible lines of future research on the topic presented would be appreciated.
