SPECIFIC COMMENTS TO AUTHORS

The manuscript provides a comprehensive description of gastrointestinal symptoms, hepatic manifestations, and recommendations for endoscopy procedures in COVID-19. The authors have a good understanding of the advance in this field. There are two minor questions: 1. On pages 17 to 18 of the manuscript, it would be better to describe the results of these studies more briefly and express more opinion of author about these studies. 2. IBS is mentioned in the abstract, but there is no content about IBS in the text. Is this a clerical error?
